Pentathlon Alberta Athlete Funding Model



Funding Model 2025-2026 and Beyond- Athlete

Applicable Dates:

- Applications will be accepted at two intervals throughout a year. Please make note of the follow dates:
 - Quarter 1 & 2 of each year (January 1 to June 30)- Applications and receipts are accepted from June 1 to June 30 for events taking place January 1 to June 30 of the same year. Payout will occur the final week of July.
 - Quarter 3 & 4 of each year (July 1 to December 31)- Applications and receipts are accepted from December 1 to December 31 for events taking place July 1 to December 31 of the same year. Payout will occur the final week of January.

Process:

- All applications must be submitted in its entirety through the google form document found at https://pentathlonalberta.ca/apply-for-a-grant
- All receipts, letters, etc... must be attached to the form at the time of submission.
- The application and accompanying receipts must be received by either June 30 (Q1 & Q2) or December 31 (Q3 & Q4) at 23:59 of the calendar year. Late applications and receipts will not be accepted.

Mandatory Requirements for submission:

- Athletes may only submit for grants within the age group/ level they have competed in. Eg. an athlete who has competed in Junior all year may not submit a grant application for U19 standards;
- Athletes must complete the Pentathlon Alberta Athlete Code of Conduct document and attach it to the application. This can be found at https://pentathlonalberta.ca/apply-for-a-grant;
- Athletes must disclose if they have applied for funding for the same event through another organization or funding source;
- Athletes must disclose if any portions of the expenses for a given event are being covered by another organization or funding source. Eg. Pent Can is paying for

- competition registration; if there are any questions regarding this expense, please contact Pentathlon Alberta; and
- Athletes must outline specifically what expenses are being applied for funding. Eg. flight, accommodation, coaches costs, food, etc...
- For developmental team and national team athletes:
 - Athletes must have completed the NSO agreement;
 - Athletes must have completed the Respect in Sport course;
 - Athletes must be in good standing with Pentathlon Alberta and Pentathlon Canada;
 - Athletes must be a registered athlete with Pentathlon Alberta and Pentathlon Canada:
 - Athletes must provide a nomination letter from Pentathlon Canada to indicate their support in attending an international event. Competitions and training camps not recognized by Pentathlon Canada will not be eligible for funding.
 - Athletes may only be paid out for two events per budget period; July 1 to June 30. Eg. 1 bronze and 1 silver, 1 bronze and 1 gold, 2 silver, 1 silver and 1 gold or 2 gold events.

Levels of funding:

- Bronze- this funding is designed to assist Provincial level athletes to attend Canadian National Championships.
 - Athletes U15 to Senior with the Developmental team standard (minus 15%) are eligible for a grant;
 - Looking at the Canadian Sport For Life LTAD, these are athletes in the learn to train stage of development;
 - Qualifying scores must be taken from one competition within one calendar year of Canadian National Championships with the same age group;
 - Qualifying scores must be attained at a sanctioned qualifying event within Alberta or a neighboring province;
 - Athlete must attend Canadian National Championships; and
 - Canadian National Championships must be greater than 300 km away from the athletes home in order for a grant to be provided.
- Silver- this funding is designed to assist Developmental team and National team athletes to attend International invitational events, continental championships or Pan Am events.
 - Athletes U15 to Senior with the Developmental team standard (plus 3%) are eligible for a grant;
 - Looking at the Canadian Sport For Life LTAD, these are athletes in the train to train into train to compete stage of development;

- Qualifying scores must be taken from one competition within one calendar year of the proposed event; and
- Qualifying scores must be attained at a sanctioned qualifying event within Alberta, another Canadian province, Canadian National Championships, or another Pentathlon Canada recognized event;
- Athletes may apply for funding for no more than one International invitational competition, continental championship or Pan Am event; and
- Athletes who meet the basic National team standard but have not attained the additional 3% for Gold funding, can apply for Silver funding for a World Championship event.
- Gold- this funding is designed to assist National team athletes to attend a World Championships, World Cup or Olympic Games.
 - Athletes U15 to Senior with the National team standard (plus 3%) are eligible for a grant;
 - Looking at the Canadian Sport For Life LTAD, these are athletes in the train to compete into train to win stage of development;
 - Qualifying scores must be taken from one competition within one calendar year of the proposed event; and
 - Qualifying scores must be attained at a sanctioned event, such as Alberta Provincial Championships, Canadian National Championships or another Pentathlon Canada recognized international event that meets UIPM standards; and
 - Athletes may apply for funding for no more than one event that include World Cup(s), World Championship or Olympic Game events.
